- 3000 BC **Noah and the Flood**— Mankind is destroyed by water and 8 people are saved. The sons of Noah are Shem, Ham, and Japheth. Their descendants populate the earth.
- 2000 BC Abraham— He is the descendant of Shem. The Jewish nation begins and Abraham is elected by God to inherit Canaan (the Promised Land).

Israelites— Suffer during captivity in Egypt x 400 years.
- 1500 BC Moses— The Exodus and the Ten Commandments.
Joshua— Leads the Israelites back into Canaan.
- 1000 BC King David— King of Israel who wrote Psalms.
King Solomon— Built temple in Jerusalem.
- 740-680 BC Isaiah— Prophet
735-710 BC Micah— Prophet
530 BC Daniel— Prophet who was visited by archangel Gabriel. He prophesied the exact date when Jesus would come to earth and announce Himself as the Christ, the Messiah (i.e. the Triumphal Entry).
- 520 BC Zechariah— Prophet
There are over 300 prophecies and conditions in the Old Testament regarding the First Coming of Jesus— the Messiah, the Christ.
- New Testament** = New Covenant
Salvation is through faith in Jesus, the Son of God.
Birth of Jesus— The First Coming of Jesus Christ. God takes the form of a Man and lives on earth fulfilling all the prophecies of the Old Testament.
- 33 AD **The Crucifixion**— Jesus died on the Cross for the Redemption of Man— the sin of mankind is paid in full.
The Resurrection— Jesus is raised from the dead.
The Ascension— Jesus ascends up into heaven.
The Day of Pentecost— The Holy Spirit descends to earth and indwells believers.
Jesus has 12 apostles— Simon (Peter), Andrew, James the son of Zebedee, John, Philip, Bartholomew, Thomas, Matthew, James the son of Alphaeus, Lebbaeus (Thaddaues), Simon, and Judas (who betrays Jesus).

95 AD	Revelation	John	The Revelation of Jesus Christ - John is physically taken up into heaven by Jesus and actually sees the events of the future as they were literally happening. He records the events of end times and the Second Coming of Jesus in the book of Revelation.
