- 10:33-34 **33** "Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be betrayed to the chief priests and to the scribes; and they will condemn Him to death and deliver Him to the Gentiles; **34** and they will mock Him, and scourge Him, and spit on Him, and kill Him. And the third day He will rise again."
- 12:25-27 **25**For when they rise from the dead, they neither marry nor are given in marriage, but are like angels in heaven. **26**But concerning the dead, that they rise, have you not read in the book of Moses, in the *burning* bush *passage*, how God spoke to him, saying, *'I am the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob'*? **27**He is not the God of the living. You are therefore greatly mistaken."
- 14:28 28 "But after I have been raised, I will go before you to Galilee."
- 16:5-7
 5 And entering the tomb, they saw a young man clothed in a long white robe sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed.
 6 But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed. You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. <u>He is risen!</u> He is not here. See the place where they laid Him. 7 But go, tell <u>His disciples—and Peter—that He is going before you into Galilee; there you will see Him, as He said to you."</u>
- 16:14 **14**Later He appeared to the eleven as they sat at the table; and He rebuked their unbelief and hardness of heart, <u>because they did not believe those who had seen Him</u> <u>after He had risen.</u>

Luke

- 7:11-12 **11**Now it happened, the day after, *that* He went into <u>a city called Nain</u>; and many of His disciples went with Him, and a large crowd. **12**And when He came near the gate of the city, behold, <u>a dead man was being carried out</u>, the only son of his mother; and she was <u>a widow</u>. And a large crowd from the city was with her.
- 7:14-16 **14** Then He came and touched the open coffin, and those who carried *him* stood still. And <u>He said, "Young man, I say to you, arise."</u> **15** So he who was dead sat up and <u>began to speak.</u> And He presented him to his mother. **16** Then fear came upon all, and they glorified God, saying, "A great prophet has risen up among us"; and, <u>"God has visited His people."</u>
- 8:49-55
 49 While He was still speaking, someone came from the ruler of the synagogue's *house*, saying to him, <u>"Your daughter is dead. Do not trouble the Teacher."</u>
 50 But when Jesus heard *it*, He answered him, saying, <u>"Do not be afraid; only believe, and she will be made well."</u>
 51 When He came into the house, He permitted no one to go in except <u>Peter, James, and John, and the father and mother of the girl.</u>
 52 Now all wept and mourned for her; but He said, "Do not weep; she is not dead, but sleeping."
 53 And they ridiculed Him, knowing that she was dead.
 54 But He put them all outside. took her by the hand and called, saying, "Little girl, arise."
 55 Then her spirit returned. and she arose immediately. And He commanded that she be given *something* to eat.

- 9:21 21 And He strictly warned and commanded them to tell this to no one
- 13:32 32 And He said to them, "Go, tell that fox, 'Behold, I cast out demons and perform cures today and tomorrow, <u>and the third *day* I shall be perfected.</u>'
- 18:32-33 **32**For He will be delivered to the Gentiles and will be mocked and insulted and spit upon. **33**They will scourge *Him* and kill Him. And the third day He will rise again."
- 20:35-38 **35**But those who are counted worthy to attain that age, and <u>the resurrection from the</u> <u>dead</u>, neither marry nor are given in marriage; **36**nor can they die anymore, for they are equal to the angels and <u>are sons of God</u>, <u>being sons of the resurrection</u>. **37**But even <u>Moses showed in the *burning* bush *passage* that the dead are raised, when he called the Lord *'the God of Abraham*, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob.' **38**For He is not the God of the dead but of the living, for all live to Him."</u>
- 23:42-43 42 Then he said to Jesus, "Lord, remember me when You come into Your kingdom."
 43 And Jesus said to him, "Assuredly, I say to you, today you will be with Me in Paradise."
- 24:2-7 **2**But they found the stone rolled away from the tomb. **3**Then they went in and did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. **4**And it happened, as they were greatly perplexed about this, that behold, two men stood by them in shining garments. **5**Then, as they were afraid and bowed *their* faces to the earth, they said to them, <u>"Why do you seek the living among the dead?</u> **6**He is not here, but is risen! 24:46-49
 46 Then He said to them, <u>"Thus it is written, and thus it was necessary for the Christ to suffer and to rise from the dead the third day.</u>
 47 and that repentance and remission of sins should be preached in His name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem.
 48 And you are witnesses of these things.
 49 Behold, I send the Promise of My Father upon you; but tarry in the city of Jerusalem until you are endued with power from on high."

John

- 1:22 <u>22</u>beginning from the baptism of John to that day when He was taken up from us, one of these must become a witness with us of His resurrection."
- 2:32 **32**This Jesus God has raised up, of which we are all witnesses.
- 3:15 **15**and killed the Prince of life, whom God raised from the dead, of which we are witnesses.
- 4:2 **2**being greatly disturbed that they taught the people and preached in Jesus the resurrection from the dead.

- 4:33-34 **33**And with great power the apostles gave witness to the resurrection of the Lord <u>Jesus.</u> And great grace was upon them all. **34**Nor was there anyone among them who lacked;
- 9:37 **37**But it happened in those days that she became sick and died. When they had washed her, they laid *her* in an upper room.
- 9:40 **40**But Peter put them all out, and knelt down and prayed. And turning to the body he said, "Tabitha, arise." And she opened her eyes, and when she saw Peter she sat up.

Romans

 31 affirm, by the boasting in you which I have in Christ Jesus our Lord, I die daily.
 32 If, in the manner of men, I have fought with beasts at Ephesus, what advantage *is it* to me? <u>If the dead do not rise, "Let us eat and drink, for tomorrow we die!"</u>
 15:35
 35 But someone will say, "How are the dead raised up? And with what body do they come?"
- 15:55 <u>55</u>"O Death, where is your sting? O Hades, where is your victory?"
- 15:57 **57**But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

2 Corinthians

- 1:9-10 9Yes, we had the sentence of death in ourselves, that we should not trust in ourselves but in God who raises the dead, 10who delivered us from so great a death, and <u>does</u> deliver us; in whom we trust that He will still deliver <u>us</u>,

- 5:4-5 **4**For we who are in *this* tent groan, being burdened, not because we want to be unclothed, but further clothed, that mortality may be swallowed up by life. **5**Now He who has prepared us for this very thing *is* God, <u>who also has given us the Spirit as a guarantee.</u>
